

Overview: Pinecrest Children's Behavioral Health is seeking a licensed mental health professional to conduct a mindfulness-based Cognitive Behavioral Skills Training (mCBT) group for children and adolescents. This part-time position provides opportunities for training and collaboration with clinical psychologists while gaining experience providing children and adolescents evidence-informed interventions in a private practice setting.

Pay: Commensurate with experience

Schedule: Part-time, evenings (6-12 hours per week, approximately 5:00 PM - 7:30 PM)

Qualifications:

- Master's degree from an accredited school in social work/counseling/MFT or related discipline;
- Must possess a current and in good standing Nevada license in a counseling related profession (e.g., LCSW, MFT);
- Minimum of two years of experience working with child and adolescent mental health population;
- Experience and skill conducting group-based counseling;
- Experience and skill delivering cognitive-behavioral and/or manualized treatments;
- Agree to employment contingent upon results of a background check;
- References required;
- Provides proof of professional liability insurance.

Major Responsibilities & Duties:

- Performs screening/intake via an initial bio psycho-social assessment to include factual and historical information, social evaluation (baseline social functioning including strengths and weaknesses), and conclusions and recommendations for group inclusion.
- Responsible for coordination of all materials necessary for group conduct (treatment materials provided).
- Leads 6-week, mCBT groups with up to maximum 10 children per group in an outpatient, private practice setting. Ages of clients 8-14 years, separate groups based on age and developmental level (i.e., 8-10 year olds, 11-12 year olds, 13-14 year olds).
- Maintains individual clinical and administrative records in accordance with professional standards and documentation guidelines.
- Maintains patient records, and prepares complete, accurate, and timely therapist notes that document progress toward treatment goals. Provides required documentation of youth behavior and activity in behaviorally specific language. Consistently meets required timelines for documentation and follows all program documentation guidelines.
- May conduct program evaluation to assess quality of care and cost effectiveness of clinical procedures.
- Regularly communicates and collaborates with licensed clinical psychologists.

- Provides resource information and referrals.

Other Duties: This job description incorporates the essential functions and duties required for this position. However, other duties may be required and assigned at times and as determined by a supervisor in order to meet the needs of the organization.

Knowledge, Skills and Abilities Required:

- Experience and skill working with pediatric patients at risk for and/or diagnosed with anxiety, depression, ADHD, ASD, and related diagnoses.
- Specialized training/experience with cognitive-behavioral interventions, mindfulness, and manualized treatments.
- Maintains working knowledge of relevant issues (e.g., medical/legal) that impact patient care.
- Complies with organizational, state, federal, and regulatory agency guidelines, as well as policies and procedures that affect practice.
- Complies with all applicable standards, statutes, rules, regulations, policies and procedures.
- Experience and skill assessing and managing risk in pediatric patients with acute suicidality.
- Ability to respond calmly and skillfully in crisis situations.
- Ability to communicate concisely, orally, and in writing, with patients, families and staff and to collaborate with other professionals to enhance care of the patient.
- Conveys professionalism, respect, and concern in communication with patients and families.
- High level of integrity and ability to maintain confidentiality standards.
- Provides patient care and education according to the patient population served.
- Builds trusting and supportive relationships with youth while maintaining appropriate boundaries.
- Ensures all policies and procedures are implemented and met consistently, including all scheduled expectations.
- Displays professionalism by achieving high standards in honesty, integrity, learning, effective communication, accepting and implementing feedback, productivity, creativity, job development, initiative, and adhering to all policies.
- Implements a proactive approach in making decisions that positively impact the program. Responds effectively to concerns or crisis in the program and is able to remain calm and solution focused when communicating information.

- Excellent interpersonal and communication skills.
